Students in advanced English classes (Honors, AP, or GT ) will read two books while all other students will read one.

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**\*Senior Honors/AP:** ***How to Read Literature Like a Professor (Revised Edition)*** by Thomas C. Foster (with writing assignments) AND ***Murder on the Orient Express*** by Agatha Christie
